## Welcome to Highland View Church of Christ!

“In early congregations, meetings were neither restrictively ‘religious’ nor agenda-driven, as are so many of today’s scheduled ‘services.’ To them, the gathering of the Body was sustenance, life, and identity. At meetings demons were expelled, confessions made, forgiveness requested and granted, gifts exercised, leadership recognized and affirmed, goods shared, and individual and corporate needs met. Most importantly, the name ‘which is above all names’ was exalted and glorified.” [Eberhard Arnold (1997). *The Early Christians in Their Own Words*. Farmington, PA: The Plough Publishing House; p. 241.]

The quote above regarding the nature of the early Christian congregations alerts us to the fact that everything focused on the life of the body of Christ.

It is so hard for us to get away from “agenda-driven” and “scheduled” services. That is part of our culture. It is part of our tradition and history.

There is nothing wrong with that. We just need to remember that the nature of the body of Christ, being organic in nature, needs to live and breathe!
