Welcome to Highland View Church of Christ!

Barton Stone and Alexander Campbell are credited as the fathers of the Restoration Movement in this country. Their vision was the restoration of primitive (first century) Christianity as the means of uniting all Christians. Campbell thought that Christians from all denominations would find the restored primitive church so compelling that they would abandon their human-made sects. While the desire was the unity of all believers, Stone and Campbell watched as successive generations of their followers became more harsh and sectarian. What started as a movement of "Christians only but not the only Christians" soon developed into a group claiming to be the one true church and a rapid institutionalization of the movement.

In their attempt to recreate the form and function of the church, the message of the saving grace of God through Jesus was replaced with one requiring precision obedience to a perceived pattern of worship and church structure.

While Highland View has made great strides in overcoming much of our sectarian history, it has been a somewhat fragmented growth. With our brainstorming sessions and upcoming elder/congregational studies we have an opportunity to work through some of the differences that still exist with the ultimate goal of showing the love of Jesus to our community.
